

Your Role as a Member of the Long-Term Care Planning Consumer/ Stakeholder Advisory Council

The Consumer/Stakeholder Advisory Council will play an important advisory role in the long-term care planning process. The Council will be limited to about 25 people, but meetings will be open to anyone who wishes to attend. Discussion during the meetings will be limited to Council members; however there will be an opportunity at the end of each meeting for others to speak briefly. As a member of the Council, your input is very valuable. You will be expected to:

- Serve in an advisory capacity to the long-term care planning process.
- Give feedback on specific topics/issues brought to you by the Long-Term Care Partners¹, Leadership Committee, Design Teams, and/or Resource Committee.
- Raise issues and concerns you feel should be addressed through the long-term care planning process.
- Advise on consumer/stakeholder participation in the proposed long-term care system.
- Suggest questions to be posed at the listening sessions.

There will be no votes taken, but meeting minutes will note areas where consensus exists among group members and areas where opinions are divided.
